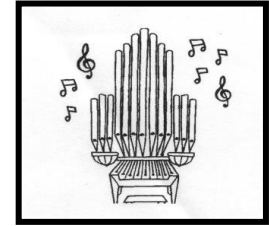
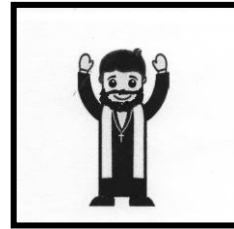
THE ALTAR FLOWERS are placed on the altar by Olin & Rita Bell to the honor and glory of God and in celebration of their wedding anniversary.
