

#### The Joy of Worship in the Temple Psalm 84

<sup>1</sup>How lovely is your dwelling place, O LORD of hosts!<sup>2</sup> My soul longs, indeed it faints for the courts of the LORD; my heart and my flesh

sing for joy to the living God. <sup>3</sup>Even the sparrow finds a home, and the swallow a nest for herself, where she may lay her young, at your altars, O LORD of hosts, my King and my God.

<sup>4</sup> Happy are those who live in your house, ever singing your praise.

Psalm 84 is a beautiful psalm, a song for Jewish pilgrims to sing on their way to the temple. It is a song of longing and joy, knowing that they will soon be home. Whatever else was going on in their lives, they knew they would be safe, if they could just make it to the temple. But there is one line here that jumps out at us, "Even the sparrow finds a home, and the swallow a nest for herself, where she may lay her young, at your altars, O Lord of hosts, my Kind and my God."

It is, in many ways a strange image – a bird's nest on the altar of a King. The Old Testament gives many details of what this temple looked like, and it is astounding: a huge multi-structure building of cedar and pine, and then plated all over with gold and precious jewels. And now in the middle of all this magnificence, sits a bird's nest, with twigs, and dirt, and bits of fluff, feathers and eggshells.

We might think a sparrow's nest in the palace of God would be an embarrassment. But for the psalmist, this image is one to celebrate. This is an image of another creature rejoicing in the safety of God's house. The psalmist recognizes that God delights in the sparrow's offering of new life just as much, if not more, than King Solomon's vessels of silver and gold.

#### HELPFUL HINT OF THE MONTH

"Could you please explain the process of providing flowers for the altar and what is done with them after worship?"

If you have ever wondered the exact process for providing flowers for the altar, this is your lucky day! As you may know, the list of those who provide flowers for the altar is published in the Annual Report and subsequent Messenger each month but how do you go about taking care of the details in providing altar flowers?

The process begins with the Time and Talent Sheets in October each year, when folks submit requests for particular Sundays to provide flowers and provide the information of whether they are given In Honor Or or In Memory Of loved ones. From there, Pat publishes a list of remaining dates open for altar flowers in the January Messenger.

Every Monday, Jamie Corrigan sends out email reminders to those who have the responsibility of providing altar flowers for the coming Sunday. The email contains a list of florists we recommend and some specifics as to size of each arrangement. The person/family who provides the altar flowers always has the first option of taking the flowers home with them, if not, a member will distribute the flowers to someone in an assisted living home or is home bound. A reminder that altar flowers used on Sunday during the months of Advent and Lent, are stored in a refrigerator and used again at the following mid-week worship service. Finally, artificial flowers are never permitted on the altar as we use only cut/live flowers, symbolizing the sacrifice of Christ upon the cross.
