Church Constitution and Bylaws:

“The Nominating Committee shall present to the congregation, at the Annual Meeting, the names of two persons for each Congregation Council term to be filled, both expired and unexpired terms without distinction. Those receiving the highest number of votes shall be elected for a full term. All nominees shall be involved in all phases of the work and ministry of the congregation. The Nominating Committee shall not present the name of any member of the committee nor shall it select as a nominee more than one member of an immediate family or someone who has a member of his/her immediate family already serving on the Congregation Council.

Time

“For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven” Ecclesiastes 3:1

The Bible tells us in Ecclesiastes that there is a time for everything we do as it lists pairs of opposites – a time to be born and a time to die, a time to plant and a time to uproot, a time to cry and a time to laugh and so on. This passage tells us that there is value in everything we feel and everything we do – value in every moment of time.

The time that we share with others can be the most meaningful part of our life. We create memories, and we deepen our connection with our family and our friends when we spend time with them. Time is the thread that weaves our stories with one another. The memory of time spent with each other can bring warmth and comfort when we’re apart from each other.

Our time can be valuable to someone lonely. A short visit to someone in the hospital can be the medicine their heart needs most. The time you spend with someone can uplift their spirits, give comfort in uncertain times, and offer hope in a time of fear. As you give time to another person, they give time right back to you.

God gives us this precious gift of time. When we give of our time to our church family, we are giving an offering of the heart back to God. When you’re called upon to talk, you speak with the words God put in your mouth, and when you serve and uplift others, you are serving God with the strength He gave you. Time is a piece of God’s puzzle, turning ordinary moments into sacred ministry. Every minute you spend in service and kindness to others is a visible expression of your heart. Your actions, no matter how small, are the unique pieces of the puzzle that make your love visible to the world.
