

TREASURE

"For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." Matthew 6:21

Matthew 6:21 encourages us to focus on heavenly things rather than earthly possessions. The use of the word "treasure" here represents what is most valuable and important to a person - their priorities. It is not about material wealth, like hidden treasures of coins and jewels. This biblical use of the word "treasure" is about one's

time, energy, compassion, kindness, faith, love, and service to others: These heavenly treasures are eternal and cannot be taken away like material possessions can be, but they become more valuable when given away. Jesus tells us in Matthew 25:40 that when we serve, give, or care for someone in need, we are serving Jesus Himself, emphasizing the importance of compassion and service.

We are compensated for the work we do in our careers with money. Success is often measured by how much money someone has or how many expensive material treasures they possess - like big houses, fancy cars, and a luxurious lifestyle. Money and property can provide security and opportunities, but material treasures do not guarantee happiness or meaning in your life.

It is not a sin to be wealthy. What matters is whether our wealth supports a divine purpose. True wealth is not measured by what we possess but by how we lift others with it. When wealth, abundant or modest, is used in service to others, it honors God. Guided by love, money ceases to be just material wealth; it is transformed from a tool into a ministry. Using wealth wisely and compassionately becomes a sacred piece of God's puzzle by blessing the one who receives the gift, while enriching the heart of the one who gives. True prosperity is measured by generosity.
